Burnaby School District invites applications from **qualified Vision Itinerant Teachers** for one full-time and one part-time position. The successful candidates will develop and deliver orientation and mobility services to K–12 students with visual impairments, beginning in September 2026.

Our team of Vision Learning Support Teachers collaborates closely with classroom teachers and school teams to support students with visual impairments, ensuring they receive an engaging, comprehensive, and inclusive learning experience.

The successful candidate will:

- Conduct comprehensive assessments of students' orientation and mobility needs.
- Develop and implement individualized training programs tailored to each student's goals and abilities.
- Teach students to use mobility aids such as white canes and electronic travel aids.
- Provide instruction in safe travel techniques, including street crossings, public transportation use, and indoor navigation.
- Collaborate with other professionals, such as vision rehabilitation therapists and low vision specialists, to ensure a holistic approach to student care.
- Maintain accurate and up-to-date student records and progress reports.
- Participate in community outreach and education initiatives to raise awareness about vision loss and available services.

Required Qualifications:

- Bachelor or Master's degree in Education. Specialization in Orientation and Mobility, Vision Rehabilitation, or a related field is an asset
- Certification in Orientation and Mobility from a recognized institution (e.g., ACVREP).
- Previous classroom teaching experience and hold or be eligible for a current valid BC Teaching Certificate
- Experience working with individuals with visual impairments, preferably in an educational setting.

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- Valid driver's license and willingness to travel as needed.
